Location & Regional Considerations

International geographic location

Proximity to North Africa

Regional differences

- Metropolitan and rural (expectations, contradictions, and opportunities)
- North and south
- Exposure to diverse populations/diversity

Physical accessibility and infrastructure

Historical Context to Frame Discussion

- Mid-19th century unification
 - Familiar north/south
- History of colonialism, migration, and immigration
 - Colonial rule in Eritrea,
 Somalia, and Libya
 - Occupation of Ethiopia
 - Importance of geographic location
- Relatively recent national discussions about race and racism

Throughlines of Race

- The word "race" is not used in Italy due to the Holocaust/WWII/fascism
 - Talking about race associated w/ fascism
 - This leads to "color-blindness" and denial of racism amongst Italians
- Italy does not include a race category in its census. This means that there is little to no data on the actual demographics of Italians.
- It is assumed that nationality = race
 - Consequently, it is assumed that someone of color is not Italian or is a tourist if dressed well.





Througlines of Citizenship

- Foreign-born populations tend to be differentiated between "migrants/refugees" and "expats"
 - Other terms include "extra-communitari" and "clandestino"
- Recent surveys indicate high levels of ambivalence towards migration with both favorable and unfavorable attitudes reported
- There are some negative associations of immigrants with low-wage work, organized crime, delinquency, and prostitution
- This affects citizenship access for people who are born and/or raised in Italy

Throughlines of Gender Identity & Sexual Orientation

Gender roles

- Masculinity
- Matriarchy

Gender identities

- Fluidity, binarism
- Effects of Romance Language (m/f)

Sexual Orientation

 Even within the LGBTQIA+ community, gender fluidity is not embraced and is sometimes frowned upon. Bisexuality or pansexuality is oftentimes seen as negative.



Throughlines of Religion

- Italy is predominantly Catholic, but despite many people being non-practicing, it is ingrained into the culture
- Religious perceptions do not always match the statistics
 - Christian 80.8% (overwhelmingly Roman Catholic with very small groups of Jehovah's Witnesses and Protestants), Muslim 4.9%, unaffiliated 13.4%, other 0.9% (2020 est.). Very small Jewish population, but areas formerly known as the Jewish Ghetto still exist in various cities.
- The role of the Vatican in Italian politics





Identity & Implications for Conversations About "Diversity" in Italy

- Relatively recent
 - More people directly affected with the conversation
 - More coverage
- U.S. language and definitions may not fit neatly
- What does it mean to be Italian?
- What are the identities that influence perceptions of belongingness in Italy?
